1917: The Beginning of Lions Club International founded by Melvin Jones

1957: Leos Clubs are formed

1968: Lions Clubs International Foundation begins

1990: Launch of 'Sight First" to help restore sight and prevent blindness on a global scale

Prevent avoidable blindness and improve the quality of life for people who are blind and visually impaired.

Our Headquarters

Lions Clubs International is headquartered in Oak Brook, Illinois USA. The staff of roughly 300 supports members and clubs around the world, as well as the executive officers and international board of directors. We develop and implement initiatives aimed at increasing Lions International's visibility and service impact.

Our Association

The Association is composed of autonomous clubs. The purpose of Lions Clubs International is to form clubs comprised of members that will serve their local communities. Clubs are solely responsible for managing their operations, finances, service projects and other issues related to membership and club life. The role of Lions International is to support our clubs and members, not manage them.

Our Foundation

Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) is the official charitable organization of Lions International. LCIF supports Lions' service by providing grant funding for their local and global humanitarian efforts.
